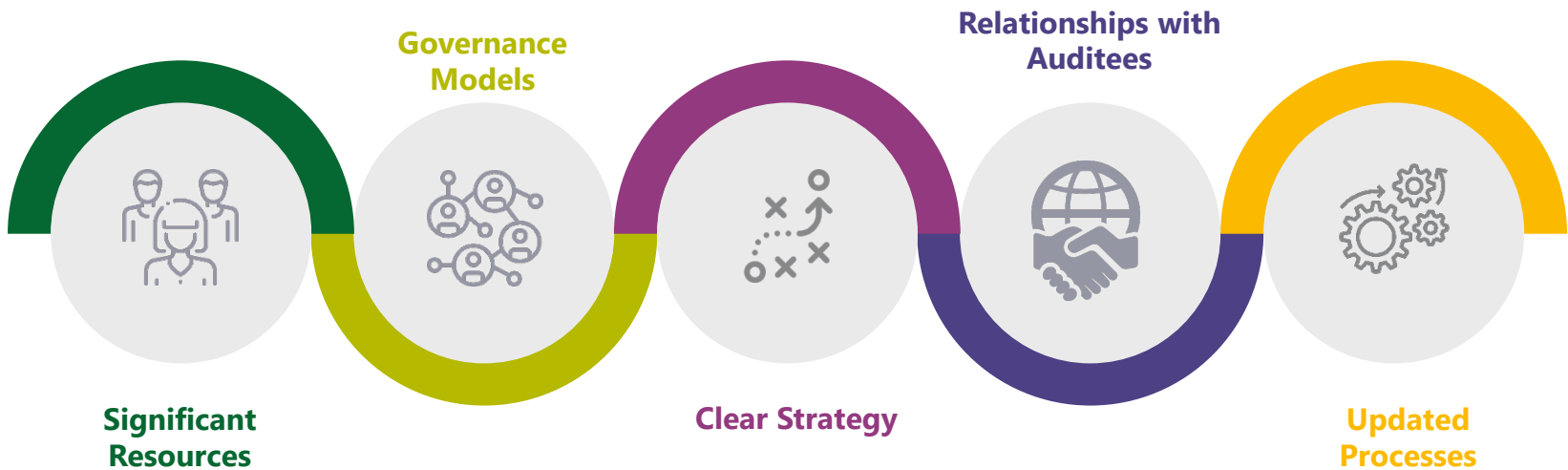

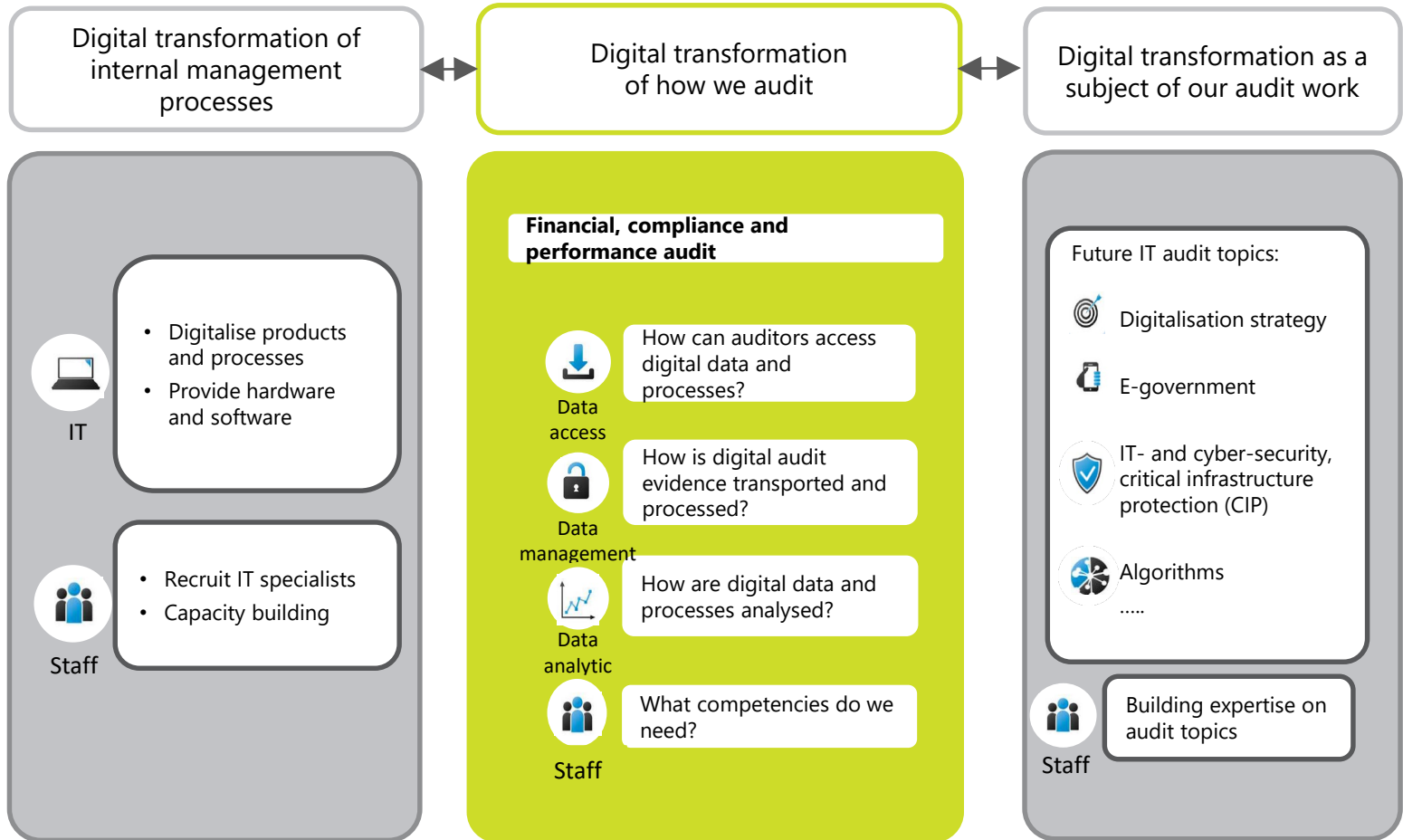
Why is digitalisation important?

- Citizens and stakeholders expectations

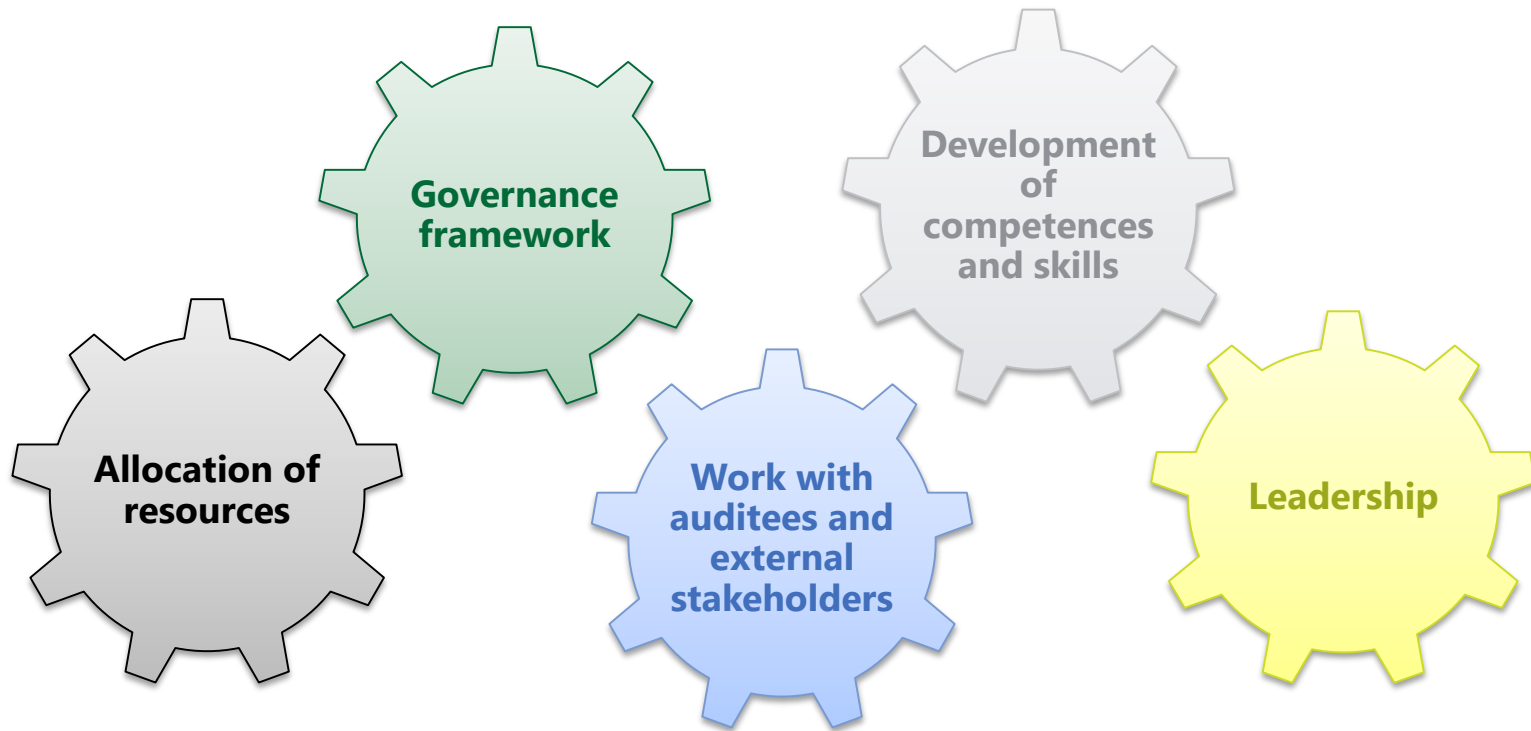

Key success factors for digitalisation



A development plan based on the ECA strategy

Objectives of the strategy broken down into areas for improvement

” Seek to obtain secure and easy access to auditees’ data

1. Accessing data
2. Engaging with auditees

” Foster a digital audit culture and mind-set in our work

3. Analysing and visualising data
4. Auditing in a digital environment
5. Promote digital collaboration and openness

” Invest in the requisite skills and knowledge across our staff

6. Recruiting specialists and upskilling ECA staff

” Implement new digital audit tools and techniques

7. Standardising processes for automation
8. Using tools and technology to facilitate audit
9. Ensuring good governance and leadership of the digital transformation
